In conjunction with its 2016 production of Britten's *The Rape of Lucretia*, Wolf Trap Opera offers a series of community dialogues exploring the many social issues and works of art related to the Lucretia story. **The Lucretia Project** comprises four free events that address the themes of violence against women in time of war, the societal and theological responses to that violence, and the ways in which art can help us grapple with essential but difficult subjects.

Premiered in 1946 to re-open Glyndebourne's theatre, Britten's intimate and haunting lyrical masterpiece is based on an ancient Roman tale of corruption and tragedy. Lucretia, the beautiful and virtuous wife of a Roman general, is defenseless against the tyrannical prince Tarquinius. The horrific events unfold – reinforced by Britten's evocative score, moving arias, and two-person male and female chorus – into a tense and potent tapestry of music and drama. The new production is conducted by Craig Kier (debut), directed by Louisa Muller (*The Ghosts of Versailles* 2015), with scenic design by Erhard Rom, costume design by Kara Harmon, wig & makeup design by Anne Nesmith and lighting design by Robert H Grimes.

Before Mozart and Salieri there was Gassmann. Following highly acclaimed productions in Paris and Berlin, Wolf Trap Opera presents the American premiere of Florian Gassmann's 1769 comic sendup of traditional 18th-century opera. Go behind-the-scenes during an opera's premiere. From the three star sopranos, whose translated names are Smirking, Out-of-Tune, and Purple-Face, to the insecure composer and stereotypical stage mothers, no one is spared. With daggers drawn and everyone looking for glory, success is by no means assured.
